Proposed Planning Changes in Yarra Flats Park Friends of Yarra Flats Park ('FYFP') Response

Banyule Council is proposing to amend the planning scheme covering the Northern section of Yarra Flats Park to allow the "Treetops" development to proceed.

FYFP (Riverland Conservation Society of Heidelberg Inc.) suggest that there are a number of real concerns that outweigh the possible benefits of the scheme. We therefore believe Council should not approve the planning scheme amendment.

What does the proposed amendment do?

"4.0 EXEMPTION FROM PLANNING SCHEME PROVISIONS

Despite any provision to the contrary or any inconsistent provision in the scheme, no planning permit is required for, and no planning provision in the scheme operates to prohibit, restrict or regulate the use and development for the purposes of the development allowed by this document.

5.0 WHAT THIS DOCUMENT ALLOWS

This incorporated document allows for the use and development of an outdoor recreation facility (treetop adventure park), removal of native vegetation and display of advertising signage"

Environmental issues

Retaining wilderness areas

Sir David Attenborough has observed that our natural environment is rapidly being destroyed by the ever-expanding *seizure of wilderness by man, for the purpose of man.* There is a widely-held and simplistic view that if land isn't being used by man then it's idle and available for development.

- There are significant old River Red Gums that will be used, especially around the "Bunyip Hole". These are some of the oldest trees in the northern section of the park.
- The old trees have scarce vital hollows that birds and other wildlife use to nest, which this activity will severely impact.
- We note that no formal independent Environmental Impact Statement has been mentioned.

Melbourne Water has recently done some great work in rewatering The Annulus billabong, which has brought native wildlife back to this important native wetland. Melbourne Water is considering a proposal to divert stormwater from the Banksia Street drain into a wetland in the park which will rewater The Annulus and Banksia billabongs on an ongoing basis.

- The Treetops proposal is over the top of the Banksia Billabong reducing the value of this rehabilitation of the billabong for wildlife and the rest of the public.
- The proposed use would likely impact the wildlife, especially around the Annulus area, that uses that area both as habitat and as a thoroughfare to access the parts of the park downstream from the proposed site.

Impact on other groups

- Commercial use and development will bring increased traffic, and will most likely lead to more cars using The Boulevard.
- There appears to be no mention of Indigenous consultation on the proposed changes. We believe that this area is of some importance to the local Indigenous community.

Other issues

- Parks Victoria claim it will probably displace the more 'undesirable elements' from the area. This is a potentially significant benefit. However, it is quite possible that it could just displace them to other areas further into the Annulus precinct.
- The toilet block will be upgraded and various environmental improvements made. Clearly a
 failure to carry out remedial works by a public authority cannot be used as justification for
 commercial use of public space.
- The proposal has the stated goal of improving the community's appreciation of the natural environment. This seems tenuous, as it is basically a 'fun and adventure park'.
- It will provide entertainment for the people of Melbourne. However, such an activity could be erected in forest in numerous less sensitive locations around Melbourne. Why should it be installed into the small amount of precious inner Melbourne parkland remaining?

Yarra Flats is an 85 hectare park which features natural bushland. A large part of this park has been leased to the Yarraman group for horse agistment. The subject site located in the north-eastern section of the park is heavily vegetated: varying between large canopy trees and dense understorey. This area of the Park has the largest, most mature and least disturbed examples of *Eucalyptus camaldulensis* trees in the Park. It should be preserved undisturbed.

The area is subject to Environmental Significance Overlay - Schedule 1 (ESO1)

These areas stretch along the Yarra River, Plenty River and the Darebin Creek and have significant natural habitat and environmental qualities. Recent studies have included these areas in sites of state and regional faunal significance and High and Medium habitat significance.

Relevant objectives of this Overlay are:

- 1. To protect areas along watercourses from development and loss of vegetation that may damage the streamside environment as a visual, conservation, ecological and recreation resource.
- 2. To enhance and encourage the conservation and maintenance of the streamside environment as a conservation, ecological and recreation resource.
- 3. To address the threatening processes associated with widespread habitat loss and degradation that has occurred in North East Melbourne.
- 4. To conserve water quality and watercourse capacity to enable appropriate beneficial land use and water-based activities to be undertaken.
- 5. To encourage the retention and enhancement of a continuous corridor of indigenous vegetation along river and creek banks in order to provide corridors and habitat for the movement of wildlife.
- 6. To protect the watercourse and adjoining parkland and its flora and fauna from the effects of polluted waters conveyed by the stormwater system or other means.
- 7. To protect and enhance sites with archaeological or scientific significance.

The proposal to apply Specific Controls Overlay 13 (SCO13) to this site contravenes six of the seven objectives of the ESO1 Overlay. It is the responsibility of the Banyule City Council to uphold the objectives of ESO1.

Other factors:

The proponent's estimates of current utilisation of the Car Park are underestimated and are not supported by any decent traffic audit. Post Covid, there has been marked increased use of the Yarra Trail and the Yarra Flats Car Park. Car parking is now 80 per cent utilised by existing Park users on weekends.

A feature of River Red Gums is that they drop branches in times of drought to conserve water. River Red Gums are particularly prone to dropping large branches at any time without warning. This is recognised by Parks Victoria in other Parks featuring *Eucalyptus camaldulensis* trees, but

conveniently ignored in relation to Yarra Flats Park and the Ecoline Pty Ltd proposal. This presents a significant risk factor for Banyule City Council as the approving authority for the Amendment and supporter of the proposal.

Believe that the best use of this space is for an appreciation of natural and seminatural environment and passive recreation. 2020 Covid-19 has shown the community how important passive green space is for nature and for human mental and physical health. People want green spaces. They also want parks to preserve nature. Much of Parks Victoria 'research' for this project is based on scant 2012 information. People have a different view of the purpose of parks now. There are significant red gums that have vital hollows for animal and bird life. This area is within the Powerful Owl region of flight and use. Birds and wildlife that have recently returned due to the rewatering of the Annulus billabong will be scared away by the noise and activity. River Red Gums are unstable trees known as 'the widow makers' and present a forseeable safety danger to participants. Area will be less attractive to walkers.

How is your submission relevant to the exhibited amendment?

Concerned that if the proposed amendment succeeds there will be insufficient future protections for the park - it will be open to commercial use. Commercial demands


may grow in the future. Concerned that a large area of the park is being included in this amendment - more than is needed for the TreeTops activity at present.

Concerned that commercial imperatives may impinge on future use by people seeking passive recreation - particularly a quiet walk. Concerned that allowing this amendment is out of sync with current community feeling about the importance of serene green space and with the reasons that Banyule residents use Yarra Flats Park. It is inappropriate use of precious inner city parkland. Particularly during 2020 Covid-19 lockdown the park was often described by locals 'as an oasis'. Concerned that the great work Melbourne Water has done to rewater the Annulus billabong and future plans that they have of wetlands in the park may be compromised by this amendment.

Proposed Planning Changes in Yarra Flats Park YPPA (Yarra Precinct Protection Association) Response

This submission is in response to the proposal for Banyule Planning Scheme Amendment C107 – to facilitate the establishment of a TreeTops Adventure Park.

YPPA suggest that there are a number of real concerns that outweigh the possible benefits of the scheme. <u>We therefore believe Council should not approve the planning scheme amendment.</u>

Fundamental issues

- Relaxing the existing planning scheme is potentially problematic Over-riding the controls in the existing planning scheme means that it is crucially important that all of the risks involved in taking this action are properly identified and appropriate controls are in place. We are not satisfied that the proposed amendment provides sufficient protections for the park and to ensure diverse users can enjoy it for years to come.
- Parks Victoria CEO has said 'that parks are primarily for the preservation of nature and culture'.

Commercialisation of public land does not fit with this statement.

Commercial development in public parks is widely considered to be problematic, as the commercial imperatives can easily override the public amenity and conservation requirements of the park. The area of the amendment is much larger than the TreeTops installation. We are concerned that the area could be used for further commercial exploitation and/or the TreeTops proposal and land use exoanded.

• We are very concerned about the gradual erosion of public spaces that are used for conservation of the natural environment and passive recreation. "In 2017, the landmark *Yarra River Protection (Wilip-gin Birrarung murron)* Act passed through the Victorian Parliament, enshrining in law the protection of the Yarra River and its parklands. The Act identifies the Yarra River and its corridor as 'one living, integrated natural entity for protection and improvement'. This legislation enshrines in law the protection of the Yarra River corridor. The Act calls for collaborative management of the Yarra River corridor, driven by the development of a long-term community vision". **We do not believe that this**

amendment is of long-term benefit to the community or the Yarra River environs.

The State Government Middle Yarra Concept Plan does not envisage a tourism park, it supports passive recreational use.

This park is recognised as unique for its semi-rural/natural character, which is highly valued by the community, and we do not want to see this damaged. 2020 has shown the community how important passive green space is for their mental and physical health, and many Banyule residents will want these spaces preserved in that manner. It is also close to inner Melbourne, which makes it valuable and for many people it is their 'bush'. 2020 and beyond people want Parks Victoria and Banyule City Council to preserve spaces, not turn them into commercial tourist opportunities. Cities across the world are investing in green space to improve health of the environment, wildlife and human population. This investment is not in adding man-made structures to the green space.

Environmental issues

- There are significant old River Red Gums that will be used, especially around the "Bunyip Hole". These are some of the oldest trees in the northern section of the park. Interestingly a number of Victorian Councils are now valuing trees economically, taking into account their environmental, cultural and social benefits. The result is that trees such as those on the Yarra flats Treetops proposal area are extremely valuable in their own right and do not need to have 'value added' by a commercial venture built around them.
- The old trees have scarce vital hollows that birds and other wildlife use to nest, which this activity will severely impact.
- We note that no formal independent Environmental Impact Statement has been mentioned.
- Melbourne Water has recently rewatered The Annulus billabong, which has brought native wildlife back to this important native wetland. Melbourne Water is further considering a proposal to divert stormwater from the Banksia Street drain into a wetland in the park which will re-water The Annulus and Banksia billabongs on an ongoing basis. The Treetops proposal is over the top of the Banksia Billabong reducing the value of this rehabilitation of the billabong for wildlife and the rest of the public. We are concerned that Melbourne Water is not, and has not, been properly consulted about the Treetops proposal and the impact on their rewatering plans (which do have community support).
- The proposed use would likely impact the wildlife, especially around the Annulus area, that uses that area both as habitat and as a thoroughfare to access the parts of the park downstream from the proposed site. BCC has declared a climate emergency. It seems to be contradictory behaviour to allow commercialisation of a green space, which may endanger wildlife habitat.

Powerful Owls nest in this region. Practical Ecology Pty Ltd in its Flora and Fauna Assessment for the Yarra Flats Treetop Adventure Park (December 2018) acknowledge this presence. At that stage the owls were not residing in the study

area, but locals have seen the owls move nests over time and it cannot be discounted as a possibility that they could nest in the Treetops vicinity.

Kangaroos are now a permanent fixture of Yarra Flats Park – something that is very special in an inner suburban park. The kangaroos move along the river and Treetops could impinge on this. The noise from the activity is also likely to force the kangaroos away.

The world is waking up to the importance of wildlife and maintaining habitats, and it would be unpopular and irresponsible to be endangering wildlife habitat and conditions.

Impact on other groups

- Commercial use and development will bring increased traffic, and will most likely lead to more cars using The Boulevard.
- There appears to be no mention of Indigenous consultation on the proposed changes. We believe that this area is of some importance to the local Indigenous community.
- No matter how 'lightly resting environmentally' the TreeTops project is supposed to be it will adversely impact other users – walkers and bike riders will have more difficulty finding parking and will lose 'peaceful time'

Safety

River Red Gums are called 'the widow maker's' because trees and limbs fall unpredictably. There is an inherent known risk in using these trees. As residents and bushwalkers, we have seen sizeable branches and limbs fall, well able to seriously injure a Treetops participant. Even an annual arborist report cannot sufficiently identify problems.

Legally BCC could be called to justify why they would approve an amendment and project where an accident was 'easily foreseeable', and concerned residents had noted the issue to them.

Parks Victoria warn in their tourist brochures of the danger of River Red Gums, and yet consider it wise to build a playground around them?

We note that other Ecoline projects do not use River Red Gums so the company does not actually have experience with this issue.

Other issues

- Parks Victoria claim it will probably displace the more 'undesirable elements' from the area. This is a potentially significant benefit. However, it is quite possible that it could just displace them to other areas further into the Annulus precinct.
- The toilet block will be upgraded and various environmental improvements made. Clearly a failure to carry out remedial works by a public authority cannot be used as justification for commercial use of public space.
- The proposal has the stated goal of improving the community's appreciation of the natural environment. This seems tenuous, as it is basically a 'fun and adventure park'. The community has shown in 2020 that they enjoy public space for its intrinsic value, they do not need or want commercialisation of the space. There is large use and appreciation of the area already, without a commercial venture.
- We believe that the community would more highly value Parks Victoria and Banyule City council engaging together to upgrade the park in a manner which is more useful to the majority – pleasant walking trails, planting, weed control, sitting and picnicking areas.
- It will provide entertainment for the people of Melbourne. However, such an activity could be erected in more sensible forest in numerous less environmentally sensitive locations around Melbourne. Why should it be installed into the small amount of precious inner Melbourne parkland remaining?
- Much of the research and data that Parks Victoria is using to support their proposal is close to 10 years old. The perception of the importance and purposes of public parkland has changed in that time. People are now more engaged with public green spaces in their area and it would be likely that BCC ratepayers would be very unhappy to see public land used for a commercial purpose now.

Summary

We oppose the planning amendment to create opportunity for a TreeTops Adventure Park because:

- The commercial project and associated land use are contrary to the purposes of Parks Victoria and Banyule City council as custodians of the precious remaining green areas close to Melbourne, and to support the use of these areas as passive recreation. The project and amendment are not in accordance with the Yarra River protection strategies outlined by the Victorian Government.
- Protection of wildlife and significant vegetation is a priority for the 21st century.
- Banyule residents want passive green space.
- River Red Gums are not safe to be used in this way.

This project could be considered elsewhere, in a more suitable environment.





Submission to Council Opposing the proposed Amendment to Planning Scheme C107

Most Council members would be aware of the ancient and wise North American Indian saying:-

When the last tree has been cut down, the last fish caught, the last river poisoned, only then will we realise that one cannot eat money.

The implications here are obvious. The destruction of the environment, in this case that of Yarra Flats Park for commercial purposes, has long term negative consequences for all. My objections are based principally on environmental grounds and my concerns about the gradual and ever present threat to the destruction of public parks and spaces that should be used for conservation of the natural environment and for passive recreation to be enjoyed now and in the future.

During the 2019-2020 bushfire season in Australia, almost 3 billion animals were affected either directly by burning or because of loss of habitat. It has been estimated that 143 million mammals, 180 million birds, 51 million frogs and 2.5 billion reptiles were destroyed. Additionally, more than 12.6 million hectares burned destroying roughly 21% of the nations forested areas. **Now more than at any other time we all need to take responsibility for our native indigenous flora and fauna.**

The recent regeneration of the Annulus Billabong by Melbourne Water has been welcomed and applauded by the local community and has attracted a large number of native wildlife to the area. A recent photo sent out by Melbourne Water shows the amazing results. Melbourne Water is also considering a proposal to divert stormwater to re-water the Banksia Billabong. **Unfortunately the proposed Tree Tops Adventure Park is over the top of the Banksia Billabong and will reduce the value of or worse still, prevent, this important rehabilitation.**

Ecoline plan to construct their adventure park within an important forest using significant and ancient River Red Gum trees (È.camaldulensis), used by birds and other wildlife. **Even more animal habitats will be destroyed.** In addition, these very old trees are dangerous because they are prone to dropping branches in times of drought and strong winds, both of which are increasingly common because of climate change. As a former resident of Echuca, I witnessed this all too frequently.

Banyule Council, Melbourne Water, Parks Victoria and the Victorian Government must listen to the local community who are dedicated to preserving the park for the benefit of present and future generations.

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Whitehorse City Council is seeking a contractor to count tens of thousands of trees, and there's a lot more to the challenge than meets the eye.

The city has launched a "data harvest project" covering the estimated 75,000 trees spread across its leafy suburbs, including Blackburn, Balwyn, Mont Albert, Box Hill, Surrey Hills, Burwood, Nunawading and Vermont.

Tender documents call not only for each tree to be counted, but also stumps and places where a tree might "reasonably be planted". Each tree is to be photographed, species identified, and age and health assessed to gauge its useful life expectancy.

Trees must also be given a dollar value under a pricing system based on trunk diameters. Basic values range from \$310 for six centimetres to \$181,000 for a 145-centimetre diameter trunk, but scenic, cultural or historic values can lift prices much higher. A Moreton Bay fig in South Yarra has been valued at \$1.7 million.

Another current tender from Moreland City Council calls for a panel of specialists to provide general tree and arboriculture services – and tree management appears regularly in local council tenders for good reason.

A study by Melbourne's Burnley College places a single large tree's "street value" at \$200 per annum, giving Whitehorse's trees a value of \$15 million a year in real estate terms alone.

The study also shows trees saving \$450 over their lifetime by extending the life of bitumen footpaths, as well as contributing massively to carbon sequestration and water and electricity savings.

Other benefits mentioned in the study are: "how gardens improve human heath, extend life spans, reduce violence and vandalism, lower blood pressure and save our society a fortune on medical and social infrastructure costs".

A range of studies show suburban tree canopies combat what planners call the "urban heat island effect" by lowering temperatures, reducing household power bills and contributing to residents' physical and psychological health.

Research published in the Scientific Reports journal found people living in streets with higher tree densities had a better perception of their own health and reported less obesity and hypertension.

Real estate agents have also estimated that tree-lined streets can add up to 30 per cent to a house's value.

One study, by global environmental development company AECOM, found streets with a 28 per cent tree canopy coverage were four degrees cooler than streets with only 20 per cent canopy coverage.

Whitehorse council's tender documents say the data capture project will be used to "manage tree assets and deliver efficiency in undertaking our street tree management programs including maintenance, electric line clearing and planting".



My submission is that C107 amendment not be allowed, and the ecological values of the area and characteristics be maintained and enhanced into perpetuity.

Matters of principle

The public parkland in question is native redgum forest adjacent to the Yarra River, with a billabong and waterhole as part of the area. The affected trees are some of the oldest and largest in the area of the Banyule Flats.

Allowing public parkland to be used for commercial profit at the expense of habitat value and of public accessibility is against the principles of conservation and of maintaining areas of the natural environment for mental and spiritual replenishment.

The way people flocked to parks during lockdown is a clear indication of their value as passive recreation and replenishment.

Our natural environment is in a losing battle against development and population pressure, and existing parkland and conservation zones should be protected at any cost. Every precedent makes the next area coveted by a developer harder to protect.

Parks are paid for by the ordinary taxpayer, so should be accessible by the public at any time. The proposed commercial activity would exclude the non-fee paying public from parts of the site.

Matters in particular

The Adventure Park proposal is to modify a stand of Redgums to incorporate platforms, flying foxes, rope-ladders and other 'adventure facilities'.

The Adventure park will be open 364 days a year.

In the early part of last century the Banyule flats was cleared to become farmland, and the vast majority of mature vegetation was lost. The area has been regenerated over the last 50 years by conservation groups in collaboration with the BCC, and has become habitat to a diverse array of fauna including powerful owls, kangaroos, wallabies, echidna's and several species of migratory birds.

The stand of trees that the adventure park would be built around are some of the largest in the area, with their value as habitat enhanced by the relatively secluded position along an elbow of the Yarra River. The secluded position of the trees in relation to the river, and their size suggests that they survived the land clearing of last century.

North East Link

It is especially important to protect as much of the natural environment of the Banyule Flats as possible due to the impending loss of 30,000 trees including the Simpson Barracks forest, to North East Link. The value of the area targeted by the adventure park is even more significant when the habitat lost to the North East Link is taken into consideration.

Conflicting purpose

By moving that parkland be re-zoned for commercial activity, which will cause significant destruction of habitat in a high value part of the Banyule flats, the Banyule City Council is working against the aims and objectives of its own bush crew. (as the project area is in the habitat zone of the fauna the BCC bush crew is working to protect)

Passing amendment C107 would be in violation of the Council's own stated conservation aims which justify the existence of the BCC Bush Crew.

Submission opposing Treetops Adventure Park

How is your submission relevant to the exhibited amendment?

I oppose the rezoning application because it is anathema to Parks Victoria's stated vision, which is "To conserve Victoria's special places and make them accessible to all".

The rezoning would allow the proposed Treetops commercial development to occupy and convert several hectares of, what is currently a fabulous natural ecosystem which has evolved over millions of years, into an adrenaline-fuelled adventure playground. This would clearly eliminate the ability and present attraction of the area for indigenous fauna such as powerful owls, wombats, possums (preyed upon by owls), wallabies, kangaroos, platypus, bats and many other species. The precious ecosystem would be lost.

It can be argued that the impact of this ecosystem loss would be marginal. That is, "It wouldn't matter. There are plenty of other places for the powerful owls to go." This is essentially the argument made by the Ecoline's flora and fauna consultant in their report. The trouble here is that, as with all pollution problems globally, all the nothings make a big something. That is, all the seemingly-inconsequential destructive actions (loss of a small ecosystem, inappropriate discarding of plastic rubbish etc) seem like nothing. But together we, members of our species, have radically reduced Earth's wilderness by about 50% and falling. Pollution abounds choking waterways, oceans and wildlife. And a catastrophic Climate Crisis is now upon us. We need to "rewild" not "dewild". The site under review has, remarkably, survived in a fairly natural state since European settlement in 1835 .There is ,we believe, no other such natural forest this close to Melbourne's CBD.

The site is a treasure and to remain so it needs to be improved by weeding, billabong restoration and expert ecological care rather than exploited as a handy resource to supplement Parks Victoria's budget by leasing it out to a theme-park developer.

Here, on the city-fringe, forest is almost non-existent, but clearly this is an exceptional location for Ecoline to make a lot of money from this business enterprise. But at what price is this to be borne by the residents of Banyule and Melbourne? Ecoline's gain is society's loss. Parks Victoria has decided to "throw Yarra Flats Park under the bus" in order to boost their poor revenue stream. We call on the Victorian Government to

recognise the very high priority that Victoria's parks and wild places deserve, to fund Parks Victoria accordingly and to conserve special places such as the River Red Gum forest of Yarra Flats Park in perpetuity.

Returning to Park's Victoria's Vision: "To conserve Victoria's special places and make them accessible to all"

- The River Red Gum forest (Treetops proposed site) is, indeed, a **special place**.
- The Treetops project will **not conserve** this special place. Rather it will destroy it.
- The Treetops project will not make this special place accessible to all. It will do the opposite. Right now it is accessible to all. The Treetops development will limit accessibility to only those capable of climbing rope ladders and taking flying fox rides. Yes, the public can walk below, but the area will be noisy, the native forest ambience will be destroyed and the wildlife will have long-since vanished.
- The Treetops project is entirely counter to Park Victoria's vision.

Why do I oppose the application?

- The North East Link will destroy 16,000 indigenous trees. Enough is enough. Save what little remaining forest we have in Banyule. The area is currently classified a Conservation Zone. It should remain so. We have a Climate Crisis and an Extinction Crisis upon us. Locate the Treetops elsewhere, out of the city and get Ecoline to revegetate and rewild to compensate the loss they will create at that new location.
- Yes, the River Red Gum trees themselves will survive the Treetops development, but the forest is more than the tree trunks and a few branches that are not in the way of flying foxes, safety nets and rope ladders. This is what Ecoline assures us will survive. But the forest is the nesting birds (including the endangered Powerful Owls), the wombats, the billabong, the platypus, the many thousands of species which together make up the incredible ecosystem of a wetland environment. That's what will be destroyed by this project.

- Ecoline's non-independent consultant report says that Powerful Owls have no nests in the Treetops forest location, basing this on their inspection one day in 2018.. This is quite irresponsible. Birds don't always nest in the very same spot forever. They move around. This is Powerful Owl country and they can nest anywhere in this region, so long as it's safe for them to do so. At present the River Red Gum forest is safe and they may be nesting there now. Or yesterday. Or tomorrow. But they certainly won't be nesting there once the Treetops project goes ahead. One more section of their ever-reducing habitat will be excluded. This is how extinction happens!
- Ecoline has cleverly used the new buzzword "eco" in its name and has presented itself in it's promotional material as "eco-friendly", "environmentally-supportive" and so on. This is called "greenwashing" and is quite popular today. It's a marketing ploy to convey green credentials which have some superficial validity, but really hide underlying motives and reality. Ecoline is a business which seeks to make a lot of money by exploiting a valuable public resource. The greenwashing is intended to sanitise the commercial and environment-damaging reality.
- The Treetops project will have up to 100 people in the forest at any one time over 8 courses and 100 challenges. So over the course of a 9-hour day it's reasonable to conservatively estimate 350 people coming and going into the forest. The business will be open 9am-6pm for 364 days/year. So we'd have 127,400 people going into that small forest each year. Clearly this will decimate the forest ecosystem. This is what Ecoline's non-independent consultants have not exposed.
- Ecoline says "branches are only removed when dangerous to the public". By
 allowing this carveout to protection of trees, where branches can be cut for
 "safety reasons", the approval will allow Ecoline to cut any branches that are in
 the way of their flying foxes, nets, ladders, rope lines and any other part of their
 infrastructure, all in the name of "Safety". If they are concerned about danger,
 locate the project elsewhere, not in a River Red Gum forest.
- The planned site for Treetops is right over the Banksia Billabong, which
 Melbourne Water has been researching with the view to refilling via diversion of
 nearby stormwater. This billabong, according to locals who have lived in the area
 since the 1950's, used to be an incredible wetland paradise, with massive and
 spectacular birdlife including black swans. The billabong has suffered in all sorts

of ways since the 1950's, but it is projected to be restored. The Treetops project will destroy this opportunity.

- The advent of 350 people per day, every day bar Xmas, in perpetuity descending on the area will cause dreadful parking issues in Yarra Flats Park, despite contrary claims of Ecoline. This will displace the many bike riders and walkers who currently use the car park. The flow-on effect will be that these latter people will then seek parking elsewhere along The Boulevard, causing traffic and parking problems there, especially around the McArthur Rd and McCubbin St entrances to the park. This is inevitable if the project proceeds.
- The amendment must not proceed.



Dear Banyule City Councillors,

I strongly oppose the proposal to alienate this unspoiled part of the Banyule Wetlands in the interests of a commercial "adventure" operation. The arguments are succinctly presented below.

- (1). Stop the land-alienating rot once it is gone it is gone forever. I have lived in Banyule for nearly 50 years but to date the biggest changes have been the beneficial Banksia Street diversion (easing traffic congestion) and beneficial residential towers near the Ivanhoe and Heidelberg railways stations (rational residential building upwards rather than land-alienating building outwards for which Australian cities are is notorious). However "They" who evidently won't be satisfied until all of Australia is concreted over are now set to violate Banyule on a gigantic scale with the A\$16 billion North East Link perversion [1]. The fight is on and we must fight to prevent any alienation of Banyule public land. Once it is gone it is gone forever.
- (2). When in doubt leave it alone e.g. Rosanna Parklands violation. About 10 years ago there was a huge furore about the Banyule Council adding wide paths for bikes and powered wheel chairs to the beautiful Ellis Stone-designed Rosanna Parklands. The local residents lost that battle and the Council splurged about \$0.7 million "improving" the parklands. In the event, from my observation bike use has been minimal and motorised wheel chair use almost non-existent.
- (3). The area is sacred to the memory of the famed Heidelberg Impressionist School. The disputed area adjoins areas in which Council has provided modest installations illustrating famous Heidelberg School paintings of the area. This is another powerful reason not to alienate this area.
- (4). The proposal violates the Eltham to Fairfield and thence Fairfield to Melbourne CBD walking track. Melbourne has lovely urban walking tracks e.g. the Darebin Trail and the Cherry Street grasslands reserve (cared for by the civilized Darebin Council), the lovely Fairfield to Collingwood walking tracks, and the lovely Merri Creek Trail. The proposal violates a central part of the Eltham to Melbourne CBD walking track.

- (5). So many of us exercise by peaceful walking that does not impact others. Exercise is good and many of us peacefully exercise by walking in what is left of wild nature in Melbourne without impacting others. Older people in particular exercise by quiet walking that is good for the soul as well as the body.
- **(6). Threat to endangered species.** The Banyule Flats is a vital repository for iconic trees [2] and endangered plants and animals e.g. the Studley Park hybrid gum (a fertile hybrid of the Red Gum and the Swamp Gum), the Powerful Owl and the swift parrot. Further land alienation in this area further threatens endangered plants and animals.
- (7). The alienation will add to the huge contiguous NEL violation of Banyule. The related and contiguous NEL Project will destroy 25,000 trees including iconic trees such as the wonderful old Red Gum on Manningham Road/Banksia Street near the proposed alienation [2]. In March 2020 I published an article overseas on the NEL monstrosity that stated in part: "Beautiful Melbourne (capital of Victoria), that vies with Vancouver and Vienna for being the most liveable city in the world, is threatened with a fiscally, morally and environmentally perverse \$16 billion super-highway North East Link (NEL) project that is set to carve a swathe through its beautiful, tree-rich City of Banyule (aka Heidelberg), the former home of the famed Heidelberg School of Australian Impressionist painters, with 25,000 trees to be felled including an ancient River Red Gum that I adore [see [2]]. Although local government councils of the adjacent Cities of Banyule, Whitehorse, Boroondara and Manningham, have taken legal action in an attempt to constrain the NEL project, this super-highway project is supported at both the State and Federal level by the 2 major political groupings, namely the conservative Liberal Party-National Party Coalition (in opposition in the state of Victoria, but in government Federally) and the centrist Labor Party (in government in Victoria but in opposition Federally). Accordingly, this monolithic monstrosity seems unstoppable and indeed the Labor Government of the state of Victoria has announced that works are set to start in 2021... (1). Cost – A\$16 billion for a dirty and deadly super-highway versus 5,246 new hospital beds... (2). Cost – A\$16 billion for a dirty and deadly super-highway versus trying to save 85,000 annual preventable deaths in Australia... (3). Cost – A\$16 billion for a dirty and deadly super-highway versus sorely needed funding for free child education... (4). The A\$16 billion NEL cost adds a one-off A\$8 billion to Australia's horrendous and inescapable Carbon Debt of US\$5 trillion (A\$7.7 trillion) that is increasing at US\$0.7 trillion per year... (5). An extra 50 annual air pollution deaths from the NEL project... (6). Pollution deaths aside, rail transport can be 10 times more energy efficient than the private car, ergo 100% renewable energy powered rail and not roads... (7). 25,000 trees are planned to be removed or at risk of being removed by the NEL project... (8). Steel and concrete use is hard to avoid for tall buildings - but potentially avoidable with green steel and green cement alternatives and readily avoidable by scrapping a climate criminal super-highway... (9). How necessary are these daily 100,000 vehicle trips on the proposed NEL? Numerous alternatives from using trains and staggered use of highways to staying home and reading a book [the bicentennial advice of Australian Nobel laureate Patrick White] [1].
- (8). Air pollution kills 9 million people each year including 10,000 Australians with the NEL this will become a highly polluted spot. The huge air pollution from the NEL tunnel will be deposited over the Banyule Wetland and what with an adjoining 6-lane Banksia Street /Manningham Road highway this will make the proposed area a high air pollution zone. Air pollution kills 9 million people each year including about 10,000 Londoners, 10,000 Australians and 75,000 people world-wide due to the long-term effects of toxic pollutants from the burning of Australia's world-leading coal exports [3, 4]. This area is unfit for the vigorous exercise contemplated.
- (9). Banyule City Council must do due diligence over potential massive liabilities from the proposed project and park alienation. Item #8 air pollution concerns in particular, and the risks associated with "adventure tree scaling" indicate massive potential liabilities for the Banyule City Council and hence ratepayers.
- (10). The fundamental "foot in the door" argument re downhill progression to degradation. The proposed alienation of precious park land may seem modest but there are powerful, fundamental "foot in

the door" arguments against any alienation i.e the alienation may be small but bigger alienations may well follow. Indeed the disastrous consequences of the vastly greater but contiguous NEL super-highway project well illustrate this Gadarene progression [1]. After the initial alienation occurs, the resultant further degradation provides a more compelling argument for further alienation and degradation. Thus, for example, economic pragmatists argue that all countries use the resources with which they are endowed, and that Australia should be able to exploit its huge coal, gas and iron ore resources. Unfortunately such exploitation doesn't stop there, and Australia is among world leaders in 16 areas of environmental vandalism and climate criminality, namely Australia is among world leaders for the following 16 climate criminal activities or parameters: (1) annual per capita greenhouse gas (GHG) pollution, (2) live methanogenic livestock exports, (3) natural gas exports, (4) recoverable shale gas reserves that can be accessed by hydraulic fracturing (fracking), (5) coal exports, (6) land clearing, deforestation and ecocide, (7) speciescide or species extinction], (8) coral reef destruction, (9) whale killing and extinction threat through global warming impacting on krill stocks, (10) terminal carbon pollution budget exceedance, (11) per capita Carbon Debt, (12) ultimately GHG generating iron ore exports, (13) climate change inaction, (14) climate genocide and approach towards omnicide and terracide, (15) increasing Domestic GHG pollution despite Paris commitments to lower GHG pollution, and (16) complicity in 9 million annual air pollution deaths from burning carbon fuels, Australia's share being 75,000 overseas and 10,000 Domestically. Australia with 0.33% of the world's population contributes 5.4% of global GHG pollution (including that due to the burning of Australia's world leading gas and coal exports) [1, 5].

- (11). Banyule City Council should live up to its declaration of a Climate Emergency and implicit environmental protection. Banyule City Council has laudably joined a large number of local governments around the world in declaring a Climate Emergency. However despite mounting some legal resistance it has failed to stop the gross environmental vandalism of the NEL, presumably because it is too big physically and politically. Will the Banyule City Council fail to stop the present environment-alienating proposal because it is perceived as too small to matter? Banyule City Council should live up to its declaration of a Climate Emergency, and the implicit support for environmental protection, by rejecting the proposal.
- (12). Bottom line: you cannot destroy what you cannot replace. After reading Rachel Carson's "Silent Spring" [6] about 60 years ago as a science student at university I was immediately converted to preservation of the Biosphere, of species and ecosystems. The fundamental moral conclusion was "you cannot destroy what you cannot replace". All species and ecosystems are priceless. Any speciescide or ecocide is intolerable already the species extinction rate is 100-1,000 times greater than normal. Unfortunately the Gadarene and neoliberal "They" are in charge and remorselessly increasing greenhouse gas (GHG) pollution. This means to me as a scientist that a catastrophic plus 2C temperature rise is effectively unavoidable. However we are obliged to do everything we can to make the future "less bad" for our children, grandchildren and future generations. We must save the remnant Banyule Flats from any further alienation.

I would respectfully urge the Banyule City Council to oppose the proposed alienation, and indeed to oppose any alienation of the Banyule Flats.







Submission opposing Treetops Adventure Park

To the Panel - 7 December 2020

My submission states that the C107 amendment not be allowed as I believe it will have significant negative consequences on the existing trees, flora and fauna. It does not provide sufficient protection for the park nor protect the ecological values of the area which must be maintained and enhanced into perpetuity.

Flora and fauna assessment / Native vegetation Impact assessment by Practical Ecology]

The public parkland in question is native redgum forest adjacent to the Yarra River, with a billabong and waterhole as part of the area. The affected trees are some of the oldest and largest in the area of the Banyule Flats.

Practical Ecology's report – rather than supporting the ParksVic/Ecoline position - actually seems to rebut it though the description of a credible habitat made up of many working layers. These include tree canopies, and trees with small and large hollows, a mix of sparse and dense understory, surrounded by deep leaf litter, with many small logs observed on site providing good fauna habitat. Importantly, all this is connected to broader areas of native vegetation.

The report documents that within the site there are many large old trees containing hollows and suitable nesting habitat for many bird and bat species as well as possums. Small hollows also occur within deadwood of the tree canopy and are characteristic of River Red Gum trees which dominate the site. The mid storey varies and is thick in some areas and sparse in others and generally providing good nesting habitat for smaller birds. Some areas within the site contain thick leaf litter that is ideal habitat for smaller fauna species such as lizards, frogs and invertebrates. It also provides good foraging material for birds. There are many small logs on site that can be used for nesting and foraging by smaller mammals and lizards.

All of these things point to a diverse and credible existing environment supporting a range of ecosystems, fauna and flora. This diverse environment will be severely compromised by the work required to set up the lines and aerial pathways.

Ecoline plan says 'no trees will be removed'

While Ecoline has advised that no trees will be removed it is obvious, due to the density of the tree canopy that vegetation in this zone will be modified to allow for the obstacle course facilities in trees and for the safety of participants. While Ecoline states that the majority of the remnant vegetation [in particular canopy trees] will be retained, their Arborist report acknowledges that the canopy trees will require some remedial work such as crown clean up and dead wooding. Installing the areal pathways, lines and platforms means that the understorey trees and medium shrubs [also growing densely] that reach the height of the canopy will need to be trimmed to clear an aerial pathway for the apparatus in particular the high rope adventure challenges or flying foxes.

This will increase the amount of interference in this area. While the River Red Gums themselves may survive the Treetops development, the environmental integrity of this park will not. This area is more than just tree trunks and a few branches being used for overpriced interactive' nature play. This area is the nesting birds (including the endangered Powerful Owls), the wombats, the billabong, the platypus, the many thousands of species which together make up the incredible ecosystem of a wetland environment.







PLANNING SCHEME AMENDMENT C 107

The Yarra River as it runs through Heidelberg is one of the true treasures of our municipality. Through the recent COVID crisis, Melburnians have become even more aware of the importance of open space that belongs to us, and not commercial interests. It is ironic that Parks Victoria are proposing the commercialization of this area of riverside bush and treetops, when the ratepayers of neighbouring Darebin are agitating to reclaim their public space along the Darebin Creek from a private entity. Banyule Council should resist this commercial venture from the outset.

The billabong over which the proposed Treetops structure has not been compromised by infill. It contains pre-settlement trees which the ropes course proposes to use as tethers for their rope structure. These ancient trees contain hollows which are used by birds and marsupials as part of the whole faunal ecosystem of the Banyule municipality. The noise of hundreds of daily visitors, every day of the year, will discourage wildlife in the area. The trees themselves may be compromised by this new, and completely artificial, use.

The proposal is not in keeping with Banyule Council's own aspirations. Council's own Biodiversity Plan 2019-2022 states that it "recognizes the intrinsic value of the natural environment and aims to conduct its activities in a manner which ensures its diversity, protection and enhancement." Council itself has identified that "Trees and vegetation provide environmental, economy, health and community benefits including: keeping the environment cool in hot weather; providing habitats and shelter for local birds, animals and insects; providing a more physically appealing environment; improving air quality by removing pollutants and lowering temperatures; and contributing to the improvement of our urban residential environment."

Once this commercial project operates, public safety for visitors will become paramount. For insurance purposes, any branch that *could* become hazardous will be removed and pathways smoothed. The safety and public liability of the ropes course will trump all other considerations. Although at the moment there is no proposal for fencing, for insurance purposes, it is almost inevitable that access will be limited in the future.

It is concerning that the area over which the planning amendment is proposed extends right

up to the Banksia Street/Boulevard corner. It would be no secret to Banyule Council that this Banksia/Boulevard corner site has long been coveted by another private consortium wanting to build a 'Heidelberg School' gallery space with associated parking and probably cafe facilities. By including this area with a so-called 'ecological' project, the gallery proposal will receive a green light by default without proper community consultation.

Opening the door to commercialisation in this way will lead to demands for other facilities in the area. I have no doubt that it will be commercially successful (the exhorbitantly high entry price notwithstanding) and there will soon be demands for increased car park, better turning circle access for buses, cafe facilities for parents whose children are using the ropes course, etc. etc.

As a matter of principle, Banyule Council must resist the privatisation and commercialisation of the Yarra River within its municipal boundaries. Allowing the commercialisation of one area opens the door to other proposals. Only by insisting on **no** commercialisation along the whole length of the river can this treasure of Banyule be maintained for future generations.







Threats, such as pest animals, weeds and inappropriate fire regimes degrade natural ecosystem processes leading to loss of biodiversity.

Vegetation and wildlife contribute to the health of the environment, the health of the community and the enjoyment of living in Banyule.

The site

The site subject to this proposal is on public land and contains a remnant River Red Gum forest. It is part of a corridor of native vegetation extending along the Yarra River. In the context of Melbourne, being a highly urbanised and therefore modified landscape, the Yarra River corridor is one of the most significant contiguous pieces of native vegetation remaining in the city. It supports an extraordinarily wide diversity of wildlife species that utilise its resources for shelter, feeding and breeding. The contiguous nature of the vegetation allows for the safe movement of wildlife along the vegetation corridor and facilitates genetic exchange which is critical to the health of wildlife populations. The indigenous animal species of Banyule include 214 bird species, 20 mammals, 23 reptiles, 12 frogs and 9 freshwater fish. In the vicinity of the proposal you will find species that have disappeared from most of Melbourne including, for example, Common Wombat, Scarlett Honeyeater, Sacred Kingfisher and Powerful Owl.

1. The proposal is inconsistent with the objectives of Banyule's Planning Scheme

Banyule's planning scheme (21.02 Vision and Strategic Framework) aims "To protect and enhance our natural environment". The natural environment includes native vegetation, wildlife and ecological processes.

Planning controls support the objectives of the planning scheme. They are in place for a purpose, to support the long-term aims of the planning scheme by preventing inappropriate or inconsistent uses of land.

The area subject to the proposal is clearly within an area of 'environmental or landscape significance', as shown in the Strategic Planning Framework.



The site is within a Public Conservation and Resource Zone, a purpose of which is to protect and conserve the natural environment and natural processes for their historic, scientific, landscape, habitat or cultural values. The proposed use of the land, as a tree top adventure activity course, is currently prohibited, as stated in the proponent's Planning Report (and hence the proponent's application for an amendment).

There is nothing unique and in the public interest about a treetop adventure activity which requires it to be placed in the proposed location and to change the current zoning from Public Conservation. The proposal could just as well be sited on private land well away from the Yarra River corridor and where it would not damage wildlife habitat and the environment, as I believe it should be. It's location in the midst of one of the most significant wildlife corridors in Melbourne along the Yarra River is incompatible with the planning scheme and completely inappropriate. The proposal should be rejected.

2. The proposal is inconsistent with Banyule's Biodiversity Plan 2019-2022 and Vegetation Protection Overlay. It would contribute to the decline in extent and condition of native vegetation and further loss of biodiversity

Maintaining biodiversity is both a legislative requirement under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* and *Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act 1988* and a policy objective of government ('Protecting Victoria's Environment – Biodiversity 2037).

Banyule's Biodiversity Plan 2019-2022 aims to "protect and enhance our natural environment". It recognises that you need to manage land according to ecological principles and to address threats in order to sustain biodiversity values. The Plan supports the protection and enhancement of wildlife corridors.

The loss in extent and condition of native vegetation is of statewide significance. The Victorian Environment Assessment Council (VEAC)*, in its assessment of native vegetation, observed that "Victoria has the lowest proportion of its original extent of native vegetation remaining of any Australian state or territory"..." the extent, condition and configuration of remnant native vegetation is the primary determinant of ecological health". The Victorian Volcanic Plain Bioregion, in which the site occurs (but is not typical) is in the 'most cleared' category, with no intact remnant vegetation remaining, according to VEAC.

The site of the proposed activity contains mature-aged, native River Red Gum forest.

The proposed activity will involve some removal or modification to vegetation for the purposes of maintaining visitor safety, protecting its infrastructure and maintaining access. In other words, further loss of native vegetation. It will also likely lead to a decline in the quality of native vegetation

on the site through visitor trampling, disruption to natural processes (disturbance to natural processes such as pollination), and introduction of weed and pest species. Most importantly, it will prevent land managers from undertaking management actions necessary to maintaining ecological processes, such as planned burning, within the activity centre and in the wider area.

Weed seeds and pathogens in soil carried by visitor's shoes, food scraps that attract exotic animals and so on are inevitable consequences of the proposed activity and largely outside of the control of the proponents. They will, over time, lead to loss of biodiversity both directly on site and also in the wider area. As a consequence, vegetation condition and biodiversity will decline.

The proposal is inconsistent with Banyule's Wildlife Corridor program

Banyule's Wildlife Corridor Program states the importance of wildlife corridors as "Wildlife corridors, or habitat links, allow for the movement and dispersal of indigenous animals and plants between fragmented or otherwise isolated areas of natural habitat." And lists a range of key functions including maintaining biodiversity. In particular, it identifies the Yarra River as a 'Major Wildlife Corridor".

Banyule's Vegetation Protection Overlay (VPO1) requires responsible authorities to consider, among other things, as appropriate:The benefits of retaining a buffer strip of vegetation within specified distances of watercourses, roads and property boundaries. The site is adjacent to arguably the most significant riverine corridor in Melbourne, being the Yarra River. Wildlife habitat and water quality are two key reasons for maintaining buffer strips of vegetation along watercourses.



The placement of 'treetop adventure activities' directly within the Yarra River habitat corridor will affect the value of the corridor for wildlife and, for some species, is likely to reduce its functional value in facilitating wildlife movement particularly for those animals that are shy of humans.

The proposed 'treetop adventure activities' will involve physical structures, noise and potentially lighting all of which can disturb wildlife, disrupt breeding activity and movement.

Physical structures in vegetation can disrupt natural processes such as the shedding of bark and the movement of an animal up a tree to find food or shelter in a hollow. They may facilitate the movement of predators by spanning gaps that would otherwise require descent to the ground. They can disrupt the flight of birds and gliding possums by creating aerial barriers and thus making them at greater risk of predation. They can cause physical injury to trees leading to infection and potential death.

The proposal will likely generate a considerable amount of noise from participants, staff, vehicle movements and so on. Noise has implications for wildlife. Blickley and Patricelli (2010) state that a

growing and substantial body of literature suggests, however, that [anthropogenic] noise impacts may be more important and widespread than previously imagined. They range in effects from mild to severe. They can impact wildlife species at both the individual and population levels. The types of impacts run the gamut from damage to the auditory system, the masking of sounds important to survival and reproduction, the imposition of chronic stress and associated physiological responses, startling, interference with mating, and population decline.

Artificial lighting can cause harm to wildlife. It can disrupt orientation, the ability to find food, avoid predation and to communicate (National Light Pollution Guidelines). Invertebrates are particularly affected along with their functional roles in ecosystems including as pollinators, predators and dispersers.

Conclusion

The applicant's proposed location for a treetop adventure activity in a remnant River red Gum forest is incompatible with Banyule's Strategic Plan, Banyule's Biodiversity Plan and Wildlife Corridor Program. In the context of substantial prior loss of native vegetation, it will lead to further loss of wildlife habitat and degrade vegetation quality. The current zoning is appropriate and, in this location, should be focussed on protecting the natural environment. The proposed change in zoning should be refused.

Instead, developers are pocketing large profits and moving on to the next big development with no responsibility for the provision of outdoor spaces. As a result there is an increasing reliance on existing public natural areas to provide the shortfall, and a greater pressure on a shrinking area of natural bushland. I do not want to see more public green space surrendered to commercial usage for the benefit of a few. Gradually, wildlife corridors get broken up instead of being increased and consolidated, to cope with extra use. More land adjacent to waterways needs to be set aside for native flora and fauna, not less.

How is your submission relevant to the exhibited amendment?

I am a local resident and frequent passive recreational user of this area, as both a walker and cyclist. I value it as a natural habitat that contributes to my mental well-being, and more importantly, to the conservation of our environment. I do not want to

see signage, increased car use, noise that is generated by even the quietest of groups, let alone the large noisy groups that would inevitably be attracted to such facilities. I am involved in native habitat regeneration. Our group of residents, backing onto the Darebin Creek, have worked with Melbourne Water over the last ten years to plant over 8,000 native tube stock in an effort to try to increase the wildlife corridors of our waterways and reverse damage done by the breaking up of green space into ever smaller unsustainably small parcels that have an adverse effect on native flora and fauna. 



We submit that the proposed Banyule Planning Scheme Amendment C107 should be rejected.

We strongly oppose the TreeTops development in Yarra Flats Park for the following reasons.

- 1. The Banyule community, and the wider community, have contributed to the revegetation, the maintenance and the protection and conservation of the Yarra Flats Park for over 40 years. We do not want to see their work devalued.
- 2. It significantly reduces the environmental values of the site; The small area of remnant River Red Gum forest is a significant feature of Yarra Flats Park. It is a unique natural stand of remnant Eucalyptus camaldulensis within the confines of the inner Melbourne area.
- 3. Damage to the health of the trees in the selected site.
- 4. The risks associated with using these trees is significant. We are very concerned about sudden limb failure and trees falling which are unable to be identified by prior aborists' inspections.
- 5. Significant detrimental effects on wildlife
- 6. The general public amenity of the Park will be significantly damaged.
- 7. The estimates of parking availability are dated and, in view of more recent increased recreational use of the Park, will now be inadequate for the stated patronage.
- 8. Traffic on local roads that are not designed for through traffic will increase.
- 9. There has been no Indigenous heritage study or consultation with local indigenous peoples.

Yarra Flats Park was established in 1984 to preserve the semi natural character of this section of the Yarra Flats after strident and prolonged local community advocacy. Over 40 years the local community through organisations such as Riverland Conservation Society and Warringal Conservation Society has expended enormous amounts of time and effort in planting trees and other measures in the park to enhance these semi-natural characters. The local community has never wished the results of their work to be purloined by a private company for the purposes of a commercial operation.

Today there has been strong opinions expressed to us, by our community, that this proposal should not go ahead.

This opposition is not new. In 2013 at the public meeting organised by Parks Victoria there was strong opposition to the proposed Art Gallery and TreeTops developments. There was no extensive consultation, just a one-sided information day, this public meeting and a selective survey, with no explanation of adverse affects or possible better alternatives. The Art Gallery proposal took 95% of the limited time for discussion.

Environment

The assertions that this proposal will sit "lightly" and "protect and conserve the environment" are, we contend, highly dubious.

The development site is directly over the Banksia Billabong. Much of this billabong was destroyed in the 1970's except for this section in the development site. It still has its old River Red Gums - some hundreds of years old. Aerial photos from 1931 show them as large trees then.

The understory and wetland vegetation has been degraded though.

Ecoline is projecting that 50,000 to 100,000 people will use this facility a year. In reality the number of visitors will be significantly higher than this as many of the users will be accompanied by parents and other adults.

A large number of these adults will walk around under the course to watch their children. This will lead to significant compaction of soil and damage to any ground story vegetation planted there.

This constant procession of people will scare away almost all wildlife except scavenger species.

Tree health and the risks of limb shedding and trees falling

We are extremely concerned about the effects on tree health from soil compaction consequent on the area's past history and the proposed intensive use of the site. Dr Gregory Moore, a former Principal of Burnley College and a noted arboriculturist, wrote about river Red Gums in *The Conversation* on 12 July, 2019 (https://theconversation.com/the-river-red-gum-is-an-icon-of-the-driest-continent-118839):

"In going to places where the trees grow, people tend to compact the soil with their vehicles and footpaths, which can be causes of limb shedding. The compaction of the soil affects soil moisture and aeration, which can lead to limb shedding." and

"In other contexts such as farms where limbs are shed, many old river red gums are growing in highly disturbed or changed ecosystems. Furthermore, many of these remnant specimens are often stressed and getting older and so more prone to shedding."

In commenting on this proposal Dr Moore suggested that compaction would be a major issue that could damage roots systems and lead to higher levels of stress on the trees. This stress could then lead to a tree reacting by shedding limbs or failing entirely. We observe many new fallen limbs from River Red Gums in the park each year - often sizeable ones.


On 9 December 2020 we observed that a River Red Gum tree had very recently fallen on the edge of The Annulus Billabong, 350m from the TreeTops site. This tree is in a very similar environmental situation to the trees proposed to be used by TreeTops on the edge of The Banksia Billabong.



We have had an opinion by Matthew Daniel of "Global Urban Forest" that the tree failed because of a poor root system caused by poor plant soil conditions. He says that compaction of the soil would most likely have contributed to this problem. We will need to assess if these conditions also exist in the TreeTops site but this would seem very likely given their almost identical environmental histories. We would like to present a formal report on this issue to the Planning Panel.

The end result of reduced tree health and limb shedding will not only be negative on the trees but also will be potentially deadly to people on the ropes course and underneath the ropes course.

On a recent visit to the Treetops facility in the Coffs Harbour hinterland in northern NSW one of our members noted extensive soil compaction around the trees being used.



The River Red Gums in the Yarra Flats are very different to the straight thick trees that appear to be the standard trees used on ropes courses.

They are comparatively bent and thin with lots of large branches. The structural integrity of such trees, even if in a health state, we believe should be assessed by someone with a structural engineering background.

As far as we are aware there are no tree based ropes courses in River Red Gums in Australia to act as any guide to their suitability.

Will the fixings to the trees be able to comply with AS4970?

Detrimental effects on wildlife

The River Red Gums in the development area are some of the oldest in the park and have numerous tree hollows which clearly are important for wildlife. The disturbance of this development will clearly have an adverse effect on these animals use of these hollows.

We note that Powerful Owls are known to nest in nearby sections of the Yarra corridor. There have also been seen roosting in Yarra Flats Park.

Their staple food includes Ringtail Possums which prefer to nest in hollows such as the ones present in the trees in the development site. There is clearly potential for them to be adversely affect by the development.

The proposal is right across a wildlife corridor connecting the park with the river corridor to the north. This is quite a tight section of the corridor due to developments on either side of the river - including the NE Link interchange less than 100m to the east of the TreeTops site.

For several years a large mob of kangaroos has been residing in the northern and central ares of the Park. These kangaroos are an important wildlife attraction. The mob roams from the Westerfolds Park area and their wildlife corridor will be threatened by the Ecoline activity.

Melbourne Water has advanced plans for a diversion of the stormwater drain from under Banksia Street into a wetland in the park which will then supply water for the Annulus Billabong and the Banksia Billabong. This is in the Parks Victoria Management Plan and has been studied in detail by Alluvium Consultants and found to be the best solution to re-watering The Annulus Billabong.

The positive affects on the Banksia Billabong wildlife from regular refilling with water will be blunted by the TreeTops proposal. Birdlife and marsupials will be scared away from it.

The undertaking that Ecoline will remove weeds and plant indigenous flora is welcome but the extent of this is vague and will be hard to enforce.

Public Amenity

The recent coronavirus situation has accentuated the growing community need for tranquil green space to have as a haven for psychological well-being and for passive recreation. This has been expressed to us by many users of the park. "The lockdown has been so much easier to bear because we have this peaceful setting to escape to" has been very commonly expressed.

Poor mental health is an enormous issue in our society and copious research indicates that tranquil green space is beneficial to psychological well-being.

Mental health associated issues arising from the impact of this proposal will include - noise effecting the surrounding parkland, visual obtrusion of the facility, signage and increased traffic generated.

There is no research to indicate that 1-2 hours on a ropes course will have any lasting benefit to mental well-being. Repeated use, that might possibly be beneficial, is unlikely due to the costs involved.

We contend that this proposal is fundamentally an entertainment facility.

Feedback from the community is that the increased usage of the Yarra Flats Park by people for relaxation and passive recreation will continue into the long term. Local residents are saying that "they have discovered worthwhile areas in the park to visit that previously they did not know were there".

Parking is now tight at times in the park with the increased usage this year. More parking will be required if this project goes ahead, increasing the adverse effects on the park.

Increased traffic is a serious concern in the surrounding streets.

The Boulevard and Glenard Drive are residential streets that are not designed for through traffic. However, there will be many visitors to the facility who will decide to use them as through routes. The residents along these streets have long expressed concern about this through traffic. The Boulevard is a narrow road that is a shared precinct with large numbers of pedestrians as there are no footpaths. Several hundred people a day have been recorded walking along The Boulevard.

Alienation of Public Lands

Fundamentally this proposal will result in the alienation of an open public parkland for a specific commercial facility. To claim that the land will still be available for all to use is dubious. Very few people who are not in the users family will want to walk around under a ropes course. Commercial imperatives will very likely take precedence over environmental requirements.

Safety issues

We have already highlighted the major safety concerns we have with the River Red Gums. There are also safety issues with children running around near the Yarra River and "The Bunyip Hole" with their very steep banks.

Tiger snakes are often seen in the park and their numbers will increase around the Banksia Billabong if it is re-watered.

Indigenous issues

There appears to be very little assessment of any Indigenous issues, which we find surprising as it has a history of being frequented by the first nations people up until the 1840's.

It is only 600m from Bolin Bolin Billabong. The Banksia Billabong prior to the 1970's was known to be a wildlife haven.

In the Aboriginal Heritage Due Diligence Report it states:

"In this case, significant ground disturbance must be established for the whole activity area as it lies entirely within an area of cultural heritage sensitivity It is the opinion of the consultants that significant ground disturbance is present across the entire activity area and has been caused by excavation and landfill activities associated with land use history that has occurred within the activity area".

We contend that this is in fact incorrect, and that the section of the Banksia Billabong that is to be the development site has clearly not been excavated and filled. It still has its very old trees lining the banks.

This aerial photo from 1974 shows the extent of the soil disturbance and this is the recollections of several members of Riverland Conservation Society.



The treed area next to the river on the far bottom right of the photo is the TreeTops site. We believe an indigenous assessment of the area is required and we will attempt to provide more evidence on this issue for the Planning Panel hearing.

Summary

It is highly questionable or incorrect to claim that the proposal will implement the objectives stated.

- a) The proposal will seriously and negatively impact the existing land.
- The proposal will negatively impact the natural resource and ecological processes.
 To claim that the proposal will provide for protection is incorrect; the proposal will have a negative impact;
- c) Yes, but at what cost when there are alternatives. The proposal is just inappropriate for the location and safety is highly suspect;
- d) How does the proposal balance present and future interests? It does not. It takes a valued, scarce "natural" environment and modifies it for short term commercial gain.

A TreeTops ropes course undoubtedly could be popular with children and we do not oppose the general idea of such courses.

However, for the reasons we have stated, this is a very bad location of such an activity with multiple serious problems and deleterious effects that outweigh its potential benefits there.

Specific Concerns relating to Banyule Planning Scheme Amendment C107

is Concerned that Amendment C107 will facilitate a commercial operation that results in:

1) Loss of River Red-Gum canopy in Banksia Billabong.

The Arboricultural Tree Health & Hazard Assessment provided indicates 15 trees directly used by the course will require deadwood for the course to be built. It also notes on pg 18 that "All trees to be retained will require some remedial work in the future such as crown clean-up and dead-wooding."

Nearly all the trees to be used have been given a Safe and Useful Life Expectancy (SULE) of 2B which indicates that they are "Trees that may live for more than 40 years but would be removed to allow the safe development of more suitable individuals" (pg 41, Appendix 7). This suggests that tree removal is also a likely outcome in the future.

There are many more River Red Gum in the vicinity of the course or access paths that appear to have been ignored in the assessment (pg 20, Appendix 1). A significant number of these trees will also presumably require pruning or removal in the interest of safety.

Thus the proposed amendment and development will result in an inevitable decline of the River Red Gum canopy of the Banksia Billabong.


2) Loss and disturbance of wildlife habitat in a rare naturally flooding Yarra billabong.

Removal of dead branches from River Red Gum and "crown clean-up" will diminish their value as wildlife habitat. This is highlighted in the *Flora and Fauna Assessment, Native Vegetation Impact Assessment and Land Management Plan* (F&F, NVIA, LMP) which notes that "Within the site there are many large old trees containing hollows and suitable nesting habitat for many bird and bat species as well as possums. Small hollows also occur within deadwood of the tree canopy and are characteristic of River Red Gum trees which dominate the site" (pg 20, 3.3.1 Fauna habitat)."

The Powerful Owl is a Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act listed species that has not been adequately addressed in the F&F, NVIA, LMP. Based on limited information, it is concluded that the Powerful Owl is likely to only use the site as a connecting corridor or to hunt in occasionally (pg 21, 3.3.2 Rare or threatened fauna, F&F, NVIA, LMP). We contend that this understates the potential importance of Banksia Billabong as Powerful Owl habitat. It is acknowledged that there are two known nesting hollows within 2 kilometres of the Banksia Billabong, one upstream and one downstream. Deakin University researchers GPS-tracked a Powerful Owl in the Banyule/Bulleen area in April 2016 (Carter et al 2019, Global ecology and conservation, vol. 17, pp. 1-12; doi: 10.1016/j.gecco.2019.e00532). Their data show Banksia Billabong as part of the home range of this Owl (See attached figure). The vegetation and proximity to the river is entirely consistent with nearby known roosting and nesting sites.

The installation and operation of an adventure course at the Banksia Billabong has the potential to reduce Powerful Owl prey species. This may affect breeding success because breeding pairs require a steady diet of possums to successfully raise young. Disturbance may also drive these day roosting birds from the area. Cumulative impacts relating to loss of Powerful Habitat due to the North East Link Project have not been considered. Given the FFG-listed status of the Powerful Owl, the onus should be on the proponents to convincingly demonstrate that Powerful Owls do not use Banksia Billabong.

3) Planning changes to an excessive area of parkland.

The amendment covers a far larger area than the site of the proposed Adventure Course and associated buildings. The scope of the amendment is likely to pave the way for future commercial development in an area currently reserved for public open space and conservation. We are concerned that financial imperatives, rather than environmental stewardship, will drive future decisions on land use and management.



This sort of project could be a good way for people to connect to nature if it was not on the Yarra River but was in a forested setting where it would be an island of interruption in a sea of connected canopy. The river red gums are highly valued by the community and they are not the right species for aerial adventures. This species is notoriously for dropping limbs and that propensity is increased by soil compaction around the base. This proposal contradicts the intent of the Yarra River Protection Act to treat the river a single integrated and living entity. The proposal intrudes into the one part of the Annulus Billabong that remains in its original condition. It is close to the Bolin Bolin Billabong and I expect it would have high cultural values for the traditional owners.





The proposal contradicts the intent of the Yarra River Protection Act of treating the River as a single integrated living entity. It insufficiently addresses the disturbance of the River Red Gums, does no provide information on how a net gain for the environment will be achieved and how the proposal will interact with the Yarra's ability to be a connecting habitat corridor.

How is your submission relevant to the exhibited amendment?

The amendment changes the zoning without sufficient justification. The proposal will

negatively impact the local ecology of the area and the ability for the Yarra to be a connecting habitat corridor. The proposal is situated in the 'River Experience Corridor.' Submission: Banyule Planning Scheme Amendment C107 - Treetop adventure park proposal in Yarra Flats Park

The Proposal

The proposal is to build a tree-based adventure park in a section of the Yarra Flats Park, located in Ivanhoe East. This development will require an amendment to the Banyule Planning Scheme due to the proposed site being within a Public Conservation and Resource Zone and a specific controls overlay to be introduced to the Banyule Planning Scheme. The proposal does not plan for the removal of any trees but will require infrastructure to be secured to over 50 River Red Gums in the area and the construction of an administrative building.

Who we are

speaks for the river as the river cannot speak for itself. We are a key and informed stakeholder on the Yarra River. Our policy achievements include the initial advocacy for the Yarra River Protection (Willip-gin Birrarung murron) Act, as well as for the Yarra Planning Controls. We have commissioned multiple reports on the Victorian Planning System and the importance of urban planning in protecting the Yarra Corridor. These include Making the Yarra River Planning Controls Permanent, Protecting Urban Waterways: A Guide to Victoria's Planning System and Protecting the Yarra: Punt Road Bridge to the Urban Growth Boundary. Through our research and time spent along the Yarra, we have built an informed and evidence-based community understanding of the river as a single and integrated ecosystem from source to the bay.



Summary

Urban green spaces in Melbourne are shrinking, and the ones remaining are under increased pressure from the demands of people, to connect with nature, to socialise with friends and family and to exercise. This human activity comes with a cost on the environment, it erodes trails, compacts soil, disturbs wildlife, fragments habitat, and increases the occurrence of litter and pollution.

We live in the Anthropocene and there are few places on earth where people are not penetrating. While we, as an association, want people to connect with nature, a balance needs to be struck between access for people and protection of habitat.

Yarra Flats Park is a rare large open space on the river in the city of Banyule - it's semi-rural character nestled amongst suburbs is an unusual occurrence in Melbourne. While there is merit in seeking new ways to enable the community to engage with the environment, and appreciate the beauty of the River and its banks, the proposal damages the environmental integrity of the area by its proximity to the River and its invasion of the canopy.

This proposal is a unique invasion into the upper canopy of the river corridor. That structural vegetation level and habitat has been left untouched because of its height. It is out-of-reach for most people, so it has been left to the birds, the insects and the possums to flourish. Now we have worked out a way to invade and interrupt the connectivity of the canopy. The Yarra corridor is not only Melbourne's great parkland extending from Princes Bridge to the Central Highlands, it is also a biodiversity sink and migratory corridor that allows species to respond to changes in the catchment including climate change. If this development was not in the river corridor but set away from the river inland where species could move around the site in a broader canopy, that would perhaps be appropriate to approve.

As commercial development on public land zoned to be protected as such, it needs careful consideration. Is the purpose for-profit or for enabling community connection with nature? If it is the latter, evaluation of alternatives for using the space, such as a nature reserve, need to be taken into consideration. If it is for both, how will these be balanced, and will they leave room for the needs of the environment? With these considerations in mind, the proposal requires further information, including:

- The intended outcomes of the proposal and how they align with the Yarra River Action Plan.
- How a net gain for the environment will be achieved.
- Protection of the River Red Gums, including the management of deadwood and fallen branches which are important to the ecology of the area.

Yarra River Action Plan

The Yarra River Action Plan sets out the objective of the Great Yarra Parklands. This recognises the network of parklands along the Yarra as one integrated living whole natural asset. It aims for an increase in opportunities to enjoy the river parklands for all ages and abilities balanced with protection for habitat and biodiversity. The Treetop Adventure Park will limit accessibility to the area by imposing a cost for the activities and may not be suitable for those with disabilities or are over a certain age due to physical limitations.

With these barriers being placed on certain members of the community, the Treetop Adventure Park does not allow for people of all ages and abilities to enjoy the river parklands. Should fostering a connection with nature be a desired outcome, the proposal will need to be assessed alongside other activities that can also achieve this, such as retaining the area as a place of reflective recreational activities like walking.

Yarra River Protection Act and Net Gain

The Yarra River Protection Act sets out Yarra "Protection Principles" of which Section 9(4) states 'There should be a net gain for the environment in the area of Yarra River land arising from any individual action or policy that has an environmental impact on Yarra River land.'

There is no net environmental gain in this project and no current proposal to deliver one. The project is about people not the environment.

Planning Controls


The GC48 Interim Planning Controls introduced the Significant Landscape Overlays (SLO), Yarra (Birrarung) River Corridor Environs which:

- Applies to both public and private land within the wider landscape setting of the Yarra River corridor. Within this area, a continuous corridor of vegetation and canopy trees are the dominant features of views of the corridor to and from public open space and the Yarra River itself.
- The purpose of the SLO is to identify significant landscapes and to conserve and enhance their character. It does this by managing the siting and design of buildings, removal of vegetation and earthworks within the broader Yarra River corridor setting.

The proposal is situated in the 'River Experience Corridor', which is the 'foreground and middle ground landscape that is experienced from its banks, trails and public land.' Even with limited vegetation removal, the infrastructure required to create the high rope courses and administration office will impact the amenity and character of the landscape.

It also requires the development to be reviewed as part of the river corridor, the current supporting documents do not assess the area as being part of a broader landscape. More information needs to be provided about how this development may impact the River and the surrounding banks ability to be a connecting habitat corridor for wildlife as well as other sites of ecological significance including the Banksia Billabong and Annulus Billabong.

Balancing connection to nature with environmental protection

Connection to nature is an important part of helping the community build empathy for the environment and is a way to help drive the uptake of environmental stewardship. The ability to use green spaces is known to be a 'green prescription', and provide multiple mental and physical benefits. Whilst these are outcomes that should be sought, more consideration needs to be taken of the strain that our recreational activities and use of the land places on nature.

The gradual erosion of our public places needs to be managed. It is not possible to maximise the quality of biodiversity with recreational opportunity. Commercial developments like the Treetops Adventure Park creates another layer of tension by adding profit to the equation. The increase of visitors to the area will weigh on the local environment. Heavier foot traffic will further compact the soil, more people will create more waste and litter. Without consistent monitoring of the environment, the degradation of the amenity of the environment will reduce a visitor's experience. With the land being leased to Ecoline, who will be responsible for protecting the biodiversity of the area? And, should that responsibility fall on Ecoline, can there be certainty that the company will sacrifice profit for the environment.

River Red Gums

The area is home to River Red Gums. River Red Gums are woven into the tapestry of Melbourne, they are of significance to Traditional Owners, beloved by the community, and many councils and citizens alike have fought for the protection of those that remain.

Mature River Red Gums, like many other long-standing trees, are 'veterans of the landscape.' From life to death they provide unique ecosystem services that cannot be replicated by human technology. Although the development does not remove any 'living' trees it would require the removal of deadwood and any branches that fall. Even when 'dead', trees or parts of trees, are an integral part of the ecosystem. Deadwood and fallen branches provide habitat and food sources for wildlife, including possums, sugar-gliders and powerful owls. When they decompose, it enriches the soil with nutrients. The removal of even part of the River Red Gums would impact the ability for the area to support biodiversity.

Structurally, River Red Gums are inclined to drop branches and are therefore not appropriate for an aerial rope course.

Conclusion

The ability to access and appreciate the Yarra is important for the wellbeing of the community, and fostering connection to nature is important, and while the proposal could enable this, there are other more inclusive and accessible options that would not incur a

financial burden or require a certain level of physical ability. The proposal insufficiently addresses the disturbance of the River Red Gums, including the impact that removing deadwood and branches will have on the trees role in providing ecosystem services. More information needs to be provided on how a net gain for the environment will be achieved and how the proposal will interact with the Yarra's ability to be a connecting habitat corridor. With the amendment allowing Parks Victoria to lease the land to Ecoline, it is unclear who will be responsible for protecting the environmental values of the area.

In summary, our recommendations are

- To relocate this project away from the river into a forested area where it will not interrupt habitat and disrupt the continuity of the Yarra Corridor as a migratory pathway for wildlife.
- Not to use mature river red gums on which to construct an aerial canopy.
- Not to establish the precedent of canopy intrusion in the Yarra River corridor on Yarra River Land.
- If a connection to nature is the desired outcome, evaluate other alternatives that are more accessible and inclusive to the general public.
- Clearly state how the proposal will establish a net gain for the environment.

Estimated 10-20K visitors would have a negative impact on the habitat of native flora and fauna on the ground and in the tree canopy.

Wild life corridor:- There will be an increased narrowing of the corridor along the Yarra River for wild life to travel.

Inadequate protection of the park from future development:- Protections to area over time could be adjusted due to contact variation by application to the "responsible authority"

Traffic flow:- Increased traffic down The Boulevard and Glenard Drive. IPhone maps will direct traffic down Glenard drive to Yarra Flats Entry Road and the safety of pedestrians walking along The Boulevard.

I am averse to public open space, in this case parkland, being carved up and used by a private enterprise to make money. Despite it being claimed that this proposal will not set a precedent (Planning Report p35, last para), it inevitably will. If Council is prepared to allow parkland to cease being public open space, I believe this is just the start of stepwise encroachment.

2) The excessive area of parkland affected by the amendment

Why is such a large parcel of land the subject of this Amendment C107? Tree Tops would occupy less than half of it, so I am led to the conclusion that the Art Gallery project is waiting in the wings. Further, "....other proposals which may arise will need to be considered on their own merits," (Planning Report p35, last para). Similar proposals might be made easier, even encouraged, if this Planning Scheme Amendment is upheld.

3) The encroachment of the facility on native vegetation and most particularly Banksia Billabong

The north east corner of Yarra Flats Park supports a significant stand of mature River Red Gum, possibly the best stand of such trees in Banyule. Amongst them are younger trees forming the next generation. It would be a tragedy if these trees are damaged in any way as their trunks, branches, hollows and leaves all contribute to the healthy native habitat for wildlife. Dead wood is as important as growing timber.

There is widespread enthusiasm to rehabilitate Yarra billabongs in the Middle Yarra section, so that once again they fill naturally and provide healthy aquatic ecosystems for wildlife; and for people to enjoy. But by this Amendment, Banksia Billabong will have a noisy outdoor facility running through it, where flooding is likely to be prevented.

4) Loss/disturbance of wildlife habitat due to human activity

Corridors of good native vegetation are vital to wildlife for dispersal and migration. Rivers and streams form the most significant corridors, and the Yarra River is critical in southern Victoria. Human energetic recreation and shrill noise is not compatible with our understanding of wildlife corridors. Nocturnal animals will be driven from the area as their daytime sleep will be disturbed, e.g. possums.

It is acknowledged that Powerful Owl live and breed in Banyule. As a listed species of the Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act 1988, all means to safeguard its hunting and breeding should be made. As already said, possums, a favourite prey, would be dispersed. Local roost spots used in daytime would be abandoned due to noise.

I have tried to make a submission via the relevant webpage on Shaping Banyule but the 'Submit' button isn't working for me so it has been suggested that I can email you directly with my position against the amendment C107.

I do not support the Amendment.

Why do I take this position?

The Yarra and it's corridor of wild and natural bushland is a special asset for Metropolitan Melbourne even though there are a lot of weeds found along the flood plain and riparian zone. In many places it is almost wild and it is wrong to let anyone especially commercial interests to nibble away at bits of it. That is what this Treetop development would be. A little chunk of land excised from the parkland which was no long available for the wildlife.

I've seen a pair of Powerful Owls along the corridor, they need a wide range to hunt for prey. Bringing so much more activity to a peaceful stretch like this will reduce their available hunting area. (What an urban asset to risk losing) Not only by scaring away the prey but reducing the availability of the remaining large red gums which I have seen described as 'animal high rises' they provide homes for so much wildlife. These trees can't be replaced, ropes in them will not be good for their native inhabitants. Melbourne Water has recognised that wildlife can be encouraged by re watering the Annulus Billabong, it would be a crying shame to do something in it's area that is counterproductive to encouraging the rehabilitation of the natural systems.

I'll admit there are plenty of weeds in the area but that will not be improved by a commercial venture. The place needs care and attention to improve the vegetation, not just to flatten it with many feet, leaving no chance for indigenous plants to colonise it.

Finally, I want to draw your attention to an article from The Conversation that I think is relevant, The area in question is not a golf course but it is similar, it is wild and 'rough' it is a worthwhile ecosystem that should be retained.

So no change to Planning Scheme thank you.

We write to object to the proposed changes to the Specific Controls Overlay to 340-680 The Boulevard, Ivanhoe East. These changes are designed to vary the zoning controls to allow for a proposed facility ("TreeTops Adventure Park") to be imposed on a Public Conservation and Resource Zone covering several hectares of public natural parklands.

Our submission is that to allow this proposed development to occur will destroy the point and purpose of having a Public Conservation and Resource Zone in this area. There are no good grounds advanced to support lifting the ban on this kind of use. As the documentation available indicates, the fact that the "treetop adventure park" will be managed by a private operator under lease from Parks Victoria and not directly by Parks Victoria itself (the public land manager), has the effect of prohibiting the proposed development from proceeding because the Public Conservation and Resource Zone that applies to the site prevents such use. We see no good reason to lift this ban.

There are five specific grounds for this objection.

1. Impact on public enjoyment of green space

One of the few beneficial impacts of COVID through 2020 has been a dramatic increase in the use of the Boulevard and the Yarra Flats Park area, including The Boulevard itself, by large numbers of people, including families, groups and individuals using the whole area for walking, exercise, cycling and relaxation. This is wonderful to see and highlights the importance this area has long played as an attractive, safe and relaxing natural public space. It is part of a very extensive parkland with a variety of paths and tracks which are used extensively by people walking and cycling. It is vital to preserve this area as it is for public enjoyment.

It is hard to imagine that converting the area into a "fun and adventure park" in the tree tops involving a network of ropes, zip lines, mechanisms and safety and protective equipment over several hectares to enable people clambering overhead, along with the infrastructure needed to support this on the ground, will not severely compromise the point of enjoying a walk by people looking for serenity in a semi-rural/natural space.

2. Impact on fauna

The area in question is very richly endowed with a significant population of birds, reptiles and animals - including a mob of kangaroos. The area also has a significant number of old River Red Gums which are some of the oldest trees in the area, with hollows that birds and wild life use as nests or homes. The idea of placing a tangle of ropes, mechanisms and safety and protective equipment through the treetops, and then encouraging large numbers of people to use the treetops "for fun and adventure" can only have an extremely adverse impact on the birds using the trees for nesting and feeding.

The idea that adding an administration office (18.2m x 10.2m) to be constructed on site using two timber clad shipping containers, an overhead roof shelter and timber decking involves only a 'minimal impact" is surely a case of wishful thinking.

It is important to note that there has been no <u>independent</u> Environmental Impact Statement. The Council which is clearly advocating for this project to proceed claims the proposal is supported by a bevy of private consultants including:

- Transport Impact Assessment prepared by One Mile Grid Pty Ltd dated May 2016;
- a Tree Health and Hazard Arboriculturist's Report and Tree Management Plan prepared by Advanced Treescape Consulting, dated 28 October with addendum dated 2019,
- a Flora and Fauna Assessment, Native Vegetation Assessment and Land Management Plan prepared by Practical Ecology dated December 2018,
- a Native Vegetation Removal Report dated November 2018
- and a Preliminary Signage Strategy TreeTops at Yarra Flats by Treetops dated June 2017.

It is entirely predictable that these private consultants have found no problems with the proposed project.

It should be noted that specialist reports prepared before the approval of amendment VC148 merely reference the previous planning controls.

2. Impact on traffic flow into The Boulevard

Banyule Council claims (in its Banyule Planning Scheme Amendment c107bany Explanatory Report) that "The proposed use will not create undue demand on public infrastructure or the road network where capacity exists to meet expected demand". Where is the independent traffic impact assessment to support this claim?

It is a matter of fact that over the past five years there has been increasing and excessive use of The Boulevard by automobile traffic creating an ever increasing risk of accidents to pedestrians and cyclists to say nothing of the impact on the families and children using The Boulevard to walk and exercise. The idea that a commercial enterprise which will presumably want to encourage large numbers of customers, and their cars, will have no impact on the roads and traffic flow in the park and along The Boulevard in both directions is a fantasy.

3. impact on existing carparks

It is claimed again without any evidence whatsoever, that the existing car park in the Yarra Flats Park "will be more than sufficient to accommodate demands generated by the use". This is stated even as it is also claimed that "the introduction of the adventure park will attract *crowds of new visitors into the park* and facilitate for informal surveillance, *generate activity particular at ground level*, and support the legitimate use of public spaces".

How this contradiction is to be resolved is quite unclear. The conclusion that the imposition of "Treetops" will "support the legitimate use of public spaces" is a *non sequitur*, it does not follow.

4. Dereliction of the obligation and duty on the part of local government and their officials to always act in an impartial manner and in the public interest.

The letter (26 October) from Banyule Council advising ratepayers of the intention of its intention to vary the zoning controls to allow for the proposed facility to be imposed on a Public Conservation and Resource Zone suggests that Banyule Council is clearly engaged in an act of unwarranted advocacy.

The advice repeated on a number of occasions in the documentation available that we can use an ECOLINE brochure as a guide to what will happen is simply derisory.

Indeed it looks very much like a prejudicial attempt to influence the deliberative process when eg., that letter suggests that the proposed facility is 'designed to rest lightly on the land' and that all structures, including the administration office are removable'.

This advocacy by the Council is even more on display when its claimed (in the Banyule planning scheme amendment c107bany Explanatory Report that the:

The proposed use is consistent with the purposes of the zone including: "to protect and conserve the natural environment and natural processes for their historic, scientific, landscape, habitat or cultural values" and "to provide facilities which assist in public education and interpretation of the natural environment with minimal degradation of the natural environment or natural processes".

It is further claimed that "a flora and fauna assessment and no net loss analysis (sic) leading to the development of a land management plan(sic) have been prepared to accompany the amendment". Where is that assessment? Again this is hardly an independent Environmental Impact Statement

The notification that Ecoline Pty Ltd, has been granted a lease from Parks Victoria to develop and operate a treetop-based adventure facility on the site is again pre-emptive in the extreme. Was there any public process immediately prior to this to enable any process of review or objection?

Finally it is noted that this proposal was in effect approved in the course of a public consultation carried out nearly a decade ago in 2012 to assess public sentiment on a plan including revegetation and new walking paths, an Impressionist Lab Art Gallery and Education Centre proposed by Banyule City Council, a tree-based adventure course proposed by Parks Victoria and Ecoline; and a stormwater wetland proposed by Melbourne Water.

It is surely significant and on the Council's own admission that while most of these ideas were strongly supported, only 50% of the 227 responses gathered in the course of the "consultation" supported the "Treetops fun and adventure park" idea.

5. The proposal signifies a process of privatization by stealth of a valuable natural public resource

Though the idea that a public space is a public good, whose value is not denominated in the profits be extracted by turning old Red River Gums and parkland into commodities for commercial exploitation may seem old fashioned, it is a principle still worth defending.

The parklands are a public good as defined by Paul Samuelson: they can be consumed by any number of people without being depleted, and the benefits cannot be confined to any individual. The enjoyment of public land involving the simplest of act such as walking, breathing, security, sitting on the ground, and enjoying the everchanging vista of grass, leaves, water, sunlight and sky are literally priceless.

Banyule Council would be better advised to demonstrate its leadership in a time of deep ecological crisis by adding to the public amenity that is already there by developing a well-funded attractive nature reserve that employs a number of people to develop and sustain this rare, historically significant, public amenity.

Protectors of Public Lands Victoria (PPLV) is opposed to the Banyule Council Planning Scheme Amendment C107 to allow for the use of and development of land in Yarra Flats Ivanhoe East for the proposed Treetops adventure park as it would remove protection of this valuable area of public land as an area for passive, peaceful recreation, animal and bird habitat. PPLV considers it inappropriate to make an amendment to planning to allow a private enterprise to take over public land. The amendment would set a precedent for further incursions and for other public lands to be taken over by private enterprise.

The passing of this amendment would represent a failure on the part of Council to protect an area of great value to the community. The establishment of the intensive-use enterprise on this land following the amendment would then result in a failure on the part of Parks Victoria to preserve the area for nature.

The infrastructure described such as shipping containers for an office would result in a severe degradation to the peaceful treed area. The equipment for the aerial activity and the intensity of the activity represents a risk to the natural integrity of the high quality conservation area.

Relatively unspoiled nature with good tree cover is in scarce supply in Melbourne's suburbs. The vital need for it was highlighted during the recent lock-down in Melbourne. It is always of huge value for wildlife and biodiversity but during this period it also became vital for the use of Melbourne's population. Any area of nature within 5kms of home was treasured by the local population. Although Melbourne is now out of lock-down, the situation we were in for over 3 months this year could well arise again and the value of the land in question as unspoiled and uncluttered with infrastructure will again be obvious.

During normal times nature is an asset available to all and can be enjoyed for itself in the purest sense. City dwellers can enjoy peace and if the land is sufficiently removed from traffic noise, can experience nature and even enjoy the sounds of nature uncontaminated by urban sounds.

As population grows and private garden space is drastically reduced the amount of natural area in public hands must be retained. The pressure on this land for human use will increase as population increases but to impose a structured intense-usage activity on the area in question is irresponsible and short-sighted.

A natural area such as that under consideration is expressly valuable as wild life habitat and is increasingly rare. An intense human activity especially one that takes place aerially i.e. in the habitat range of birds effectively removes this habitat from the inhabitants. Netting as described is an obvious trap for wildlife, especially birds and bats. Inevitably there will be significant noise from humans taking part in an adventure experience, e.g. shouting, screaming. This would no doubt have an adverse effect on nocturnal animals, asleep during the day (e.g. owls, bats, possums) and on people trying to passively enjoy the park.

One has to question who loses and who benefits from this proposal. It is clear that animal life loses, the public loses, and only a private enterprise gains.

The role of Parks Victoria should be to preserve and manage natural areas and the plant and animal species within them so that these places can be enjoyed by present and future generations Exploitation is not sustainable.

If the activity proposed – a tree based adventure park is desirable for those seeking it then it should be on private land. The public should not be deprived of the asset they presently have.

We hope that this Amendment is not be passed by the council.

- The area applying to the amendment is much greater than required.

1. An Inadequate number if people know about the proposal - The park is used by more people in Melbourne than just local residents who have used it over the last 2 months - and seen the advertising sign.

It is important to many of those people who may only visit the site once in a few months or even a few years, - that the Yarra River surrounds retain and have restored - their "wild" values and many would consider a private proposal in such a Park- was really an impossibility !- as the River is part of Melbourne's "protected" "Green Wedge" - which most people believe is meant to be kept in as natural condition as possible - by Govt authorities. Those more in the know (ie who read newspapers and politicias announcements in them) think Melbourne Water is restoring Billabongs - NOT killing them !! and that Parks Victoria Protects cultural values and the environment - rather than degrades them for Profit motives !!

More thorough advertising across Melbourne should be undertaken before such a proposal is considered and questions should also be asked in Parliament of Politicians and Heads of Departments who seem to have been duplicitous in this matter.

- 2. The advertising in Councils Shaping Banyule website is misleading
- 3. Same advertising is inadequate for the average person to FIND all the documentation needed to be reviewed .
- 4. Many statements in the Proponents Materials are without foundation; but may be presumed to be correct by people not familiar with Planning Processes and how regularly "Planning Experts" writing reports " stretch" the truth; "leave out" the truth; "mislead" and "obscure" the truth in such documents
- 5. Usually Council organizes public meetings to help uncover these pieces of incomplete / untrue/misleading / obscuring "truths" Q and A from the public or another expert often uncovers inadequacies in proponents reports that then become plain to everyone (present) and allows everyone to complain about the "evidence" NO SUCH MEETINGS WERE ORGANISED

6. In allowing for such meetings via Public Request - Council may have tried to impress with its impartiality - BUT in fact BY omitting a Q and A for such an important matter and advertising this widely throughout Melbourne for its availability over a significant timeline of a few weeks - Council has actually hidden this proposal in plain view (ON a small font sign with no highlighting and no clear Visual cues for the importance of the proposal - in over turning accepted practice by GOVT authorities (ie NO Colours Exclamations Pictures etc etc- as would be done with a product advert in the media)

This conventional sign makes anything on it look humdrum and of no real interest to the average member of the public.

- 7. The advertising of the proposal also does NOT mention the billabong and deep water hole under the proposed tree branch walkways and the normal operation of these. It is left for the public to discover this for them selves by venturing into unmarked scrub amid snakes and other the hazards of an unmade path.
- 8. The pictures of the proposal on Council website are NOT of the ACTUAL SITE BUT instead a different site with different types of trees!! IN fact no example is given by the proponent these types of trees being used anywhere for a similar activity!! Also no examples of the same types of activities being undertaken over ephemeral billabongs and so close to a major river!! (Let alone within a GREEN WEDGE SITE) NO examples are given of a similar activity having access off a local road with less than 200 metres of in a high density shopping centre OR within 0 metres of a suburban middle ring suburb Residential Zone!
- 9. The strength of RED GUM WOOD is not an adequate representation of the ability of the existing trees to withstand the forces to be imposed by the proposal. The nature of the soil around the trees its degree of saturation or dryness is also relevant to the trees overall stability and this will change over time if the Billabong is truly allowed to survive as a natural system.
- 10. The degree of branch clearing is also not made clear in the proposal In tall forests lower branches do not need to be removed for access and security and all the proposal representations in the documentation are in tall forests. The characteristic gnarly spreading shape and beauty of Red Gum Trees will be destroyed by this proposal. One tree is in fact almost horizontally leaning over the proposal site what will be its fate ? Will it be removed after some time? When it seems to be in the way of improving the ropes course or perhaps a "danger of falling" hazard to a busy public place ?
- 11. A I enjoy knowing that there is a wide linear park along the Yarra That is in Melbourne's most first and most important Green Wedge where we are preserving the natural environment for all to enjoy passive recreation (Like walking and sitting reading and painting and picnicking but also at the same time, for absorbing the atmosphere of a truly natural environment, that is associated with aboriginal ways of life and the local history of the Heidelberg School Artists Camps and the iconic rural landscapes that history amplifies and idolises. Ie I enjoy knowing we are a society that values these things above private interests and peace and quiet of the environment (especially here in Banyule) being valued above the razamataz of the fairground activity of a ropes course.

- 11. B I cant see how anyone can learn about the natural environment while suspended on a rope or on a bridge or ladder or concentrating on where each footstep will go? They would learn though from a low key low visitation board walk with access to the water within the billabong in the wet seasons where there is:
- time for reflection
- room for small groups with leaders to talk
- Quiet times for the local animals and other minute wildlife -to recover between visits
- no screaming and calling from excited parents and tourists at an Adventure Park.
- where there could even be high bridges and group walks in the air perhaps? and looking into tree hollows with mirrors on sticks? BUT the design would be different to what is proposed here which is basically a face paint, carnival atmosphere where skill is pitched against a course; and "adventures" had ..
- I dearly remember a "Gould League " tour of our local "golf course" when I was a child in the country. We had guides and were split up into smaller groups so as not to alarm the wildlife . We saw into nests in tree hollows (with mirrors on tall sticks), were alarmed by a huge goanna rushing past us ! and spent time looking at tiny insects and native flowers that we otherwise would not have noticed

I have also been on many Parks Walks (all over Australia) with National Park staff - with my children when they were growing up - and as an adult - often these would be at night or dusk and being quiet was essential - to see the marvels of wildlife we saw - and often we waited for ages - for just the right moment to view what we came to see - THAT is how you learn about Nature -not rushing around an articial ropes course !! in face paint !!

- 11C. Council and Parks Victoria should be working towards a vision similar to this -
- We have a group studying microbats in the south of this same Park
- We have small groups going out at night with the Platypus Conservancy surveys
- We have children who would love to see how a billabong works (just like this one) and to be able to walk though it when dry and be told what the locations of the various plants and muds mean or to come back when it is in flood to just sit and wonder?
- Any learning through a hi9gh volume ropes course will be quite artificial and short lived and probably inaccurate. True biologists are not going to waste their time giving their expertise to such a scheme.
- And people are not going to pay for that quiet learning experience as much as they will pay for the carnival act
- Supply and Demand will ensure carnival values win out and the environment suffers
- Any lease will probably be short lived if restrictions to protect the environment are vigorously enforced Then a clean up is required and the natural landscape costs money to repair

- Taking on this proposal is an error probably enforced by well meaning bean counters who do not understand the ecosystems and the and how it functions on very small margins of biotic and abiotic difference.
- WE CAN DO MUCH BETTER AT LOW COST
- 12. I enjoy seeing from a distance the open vista of this space and re-imagining our aboriginal and artistic heritage. (Remember original red gum forests managed by aboriginal fire techniques were like "open parkland" (as described by early explores and settlers (with swathes of lush green grasses and only scattered large red gum trees (see land preserved by the Hamer State Govt between Tullarmarine Airport and Woodlands Homestead for an idea of what this looks like (a Preserved Open Red Gum Floodplain) still full of 100s of years old Trees due to covenants on the land
- 13. I feel secure and safe for our future as a society that our political processes acknowledge and protect these very important values for many generations to come. This sense of the security of Planning Consistency will be destroyed by this proposal EG The CEO of Parks Victoria has been quoted (November 2020) as saying parks are "primarily for the preservation of nature and culture". How can I trust such a society (and CEO Representing Society) if natural values are damaged by these proposals and the relevant authority "passes the buck" for management to private interests and reliance on a public complaints process to maintain control?
- 14. How will such matters be controlled? If Parks Vic or Council need to continuously patrol and check up on compliance any perceived financial benefit will be eroded and possibly lost altogether or even sent into reverse!!
- 15. I would be mentally distressed to feel we would, as a society, alienate some of this prized resource to commercial interests and allow the profit motive to constantly "be at the heels of " or harry, the public execution of the myriad other interests for this environment For Exampoe: By in this case constantly being able to request changes to, or reviews of:
- o alterations to billabong flows ,and billabong management
- o alterations to natural process of tree decay and snag build up in the river and billabongs
- o extra fencing
- o extra signage
- o Extra parking (and thus hard surface and heat absorbing area)
- o Extra toilets (and thus more built form that distracts from naturalistic view lines)
- o Extra security (for private property) that involves extra community costs
- o Extra telecommunications and water and energy services (to support the business)
- o Thus tying up valuable Council Officer and Sate Government officials time and
- o Tying up community time monitoring and advising council or other authorities of any breachers to codes or rules and conditions for this private proposal
 - Why would we give ourselves this burden?

In conclusion:

- The Yarra Flats Park is a unique, natural environment that is extensively used for passive recreation and is highly valued across Melbourne as an iconic representation of Melbourne's Artistic Heritage and Natural Values
- Billabong's are similarly revered but the position of the naturally cycling billabong and the offshoot to the "Bunyip Hole" in this proposal has been obscured in Councils adverting of the proposal.
- Inadequate types of Public Consultation have been held to test the validity of the proponents representations in front of Public Meetings where the less informed are better able to judge the answers of the proponents relative to the questions asked and where the public can then follow up new matters of concern after the meeting
- The park should not be commercialised This is an anathema to higher public conservation value for access to a natural environment for the large population of Melbourne.
- Ropes Courses and Adventure Activities (and with a large customer base) can take place all over Melbournes outskirts in many Tall forests often on private property They do not need to be in a location with so many conflicts of public aspiration . People DO NOT NEED this type of adventure activity close to home but for mental health they do need to feel secure that natural spaces are available close by to be immersed in and have peaceful reflection in (without having to access busy car parks and traffic Jams)
- No matter how "lightly resting" the proposal may be, erecting an intrusive structure in this precious natural environment will be detrimental to the park.
- I am concerned about the increased vehicle traffic in my area (where I shop and visit local attractions every day and every week in particular the way traffic already screams in torrents along Manningham Road and Banksia Street and the volume of traffic at most parts of the day (going in all directions) that creates long impatient queues on roads that tempt tolerance and good driving and how that could translate to risk taking as well as to "rat running" in normally quiet residential streets
- I am concerned that Parking, Toilets, Fencing and all manner of hard edge development will increase over time as this proposal becomes established and we will lose our quiet " rural" heritage icon park.
- Banyule ratepayers would be better served by Council assisting Parks Victoria to preserve and enhance the "natural state" of Yarra Flats Park and its use for passive recreation rather than dealing with crowds and traffic jams and having to upgrade amenities
- Plants including Trees and the Wildlife that populate the park, will be adversely impacted in many many ways , but in particular, the lack of a naturally functioning billabong will be a great loss.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed Banyule Planning Scheme Amendment C107, including the introduction of the Special Controls Overlay and Incorporated Document.

Overall, is supportive of the proposal for an outdoor recreation facility (treetop adventure park) subject to the advice and recommendations below.

Site Context

This property is located adjacent to the Yarra River and is subject to inundation from the waterway. The applicable flood level for a storm event with a 1% chance of occurrence (AEP) in any given year is 18.22 metre to AHD. Flood depths on the property for a 1% AEP storm event will be significant (reaching up to 4-5 metres). The site will also be inundated in more frequent storm events and from Melbourne Water's stormwater billabong program as outlined below.

Proposal Background

In 2013 Parks Victoria, in consultation with and key stakeholders, developed a concept plan for Yarra Flats Parkland that would see overall upgrades within the parkland, including upgrade works to Banksia St Billabongs and Annulus Billabong (boardwalks and bird hides). The concept plan also highlighted a high ropes course within the parkland. The original proposal for the course location was located further south and was smaller to the one currently proposed.

Comment on Current Proposal

While maintains overall support for the proposal, it is noted that the ropes course may be affected by upcoming Melbourne Water works and stormwater management projects. Specifically, Melbourne Water is planning works in the area which involve the construction of a new wetland to treat stormwater from the Banksia Street Drain and to provide alternative water for Annulus Billabong and Banksia Street





Billabong. This will likely result in these billabongs being inundated more often and for longer periods of time. A trail watering event has recently been completed at Annulus Billabong using funding from DELWP as part of the Yarra Strategic Plan to investigate and initiate the larger project in the area. In addition, this year natural overbank flooding of the Banksia Street Billabong has resulted in the billabong being inundated for the majority of this year.

The proposed location of the ropes course is directly over the Banksia Street billabong, which means that the ground underneath the ropes course may be inundated for long periods of time. This may impact on the operation of the ropes course, for example through increased odour, lack of access at ground level and increased insect populations.

has recommended the inclusion of an additional condition outlined below that requires the proponent to enter into an agreement with Melbourne Water and Parks Victoria so that the full management and operational implications of the above stormwater management projects are disclosed and accepted. In particular, Melbourne Water seeks to make the company running the ropes course aware that they are planning to set up the ropes course over a billabong and that this may impact the use of the land for a significant period of time.

Recommendations

recommends the incorporated document be amended as follows:

- The addition of the following requirements under Condition 6.2:
 - A flood management plan must be submitted and approved as per Condition 6.31
 - A cut and fill plan must be submitted and approved as per Condition 6.34.
 - An agreement must be entered into as per the condition below.
- The addition of new conditions as follows:
 - Prior to the commencement of works, an agreement must be entered into with Melbourne Water and Parks Victoria to provide for the following:
 - Disclosure of the likely future inundation to the ropes course area.
 - Agreement on the management regime of the ropes course/billabong area including the timing, frequency and notice period regarding Melbourne Water's release of flow into the billabongs.
 - Agreement on access arrangements for the billabong areas.
 - The shipping containers must only be used for the temporary storage of equipment necessary for the functioning of the ropes course, noting that they will be subject to frequent and significant inundation from the Yarra River.



The following submission from the Corporations' Water Unit is tabled for Banyule's consideration:

Established over 35 years ago, the Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung Cultural Heritage Aboriginal Corporation (the Corporation) is the peak body for the Wurundjeri Woi wurrung people, the Traditional Owners of a large estate with includes Banyule. The Corporation is a self-funded charity which provides culturally relevant employment for its members, and opportunities for engagement with Wurundjeri Woi wurrung people and culture.

The Corporation operates in a complex federal, state and local government legislative and policy ecosystem including planning and environmental statutes. The Australian Government has also ratified UN declarations that have a bearing on how the State and its agents should work with First Peoples. Two significant Victorian legislative frameworks that the Corporation operates within include the Victorian Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act (2006) (the Corporation was appointed as a Registered Aboriginal Party in 2008 over a portion of Wurundjeri Woi wurrung Country), and the Yarra River Protection Act (Wilip gin Birrarung murron) (2017) which identifies and acknowledges the Wurundjeri Woi wurrung as the Traditional Owners of the Birrarung. This Act identifies various Responsible Public Entities (RPE's) with governance responsibilities to ensure the management of the Birrarung and its declared lands as one living, integrated entity. Both Banyule and Parks Victoria are RPE's and have worked on the Yarra Collaboration Committee with Wurundjeri Woi wurrung as an equal partner in the development of the Yarra Strategic Plan.

In June 2018, The Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) disbursed funding to the Wurundjeri Woi- wurrung Cultural Heritage Aboriginal Corporation (Water Unit) to enable the Corporation to manage and deliver a pilot Cultural Values Study (CVS). During the course of December 2018 and April 2020, the CVS documented the cultural significance of Bulleen Banyule Flats (Heidelberg and Bulleen) stretch of the *Birrarung* (Yarra River) within the traditional extent of Wurundjeri willam Country. By investigating historical and present-day land use and occupancy in conjunction with Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung knowledge recording, the Bulleen-Banyule Flats was identified as a cultural landscape. The cultural landscape is significant for its role in the social life of Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung Ancestors, their historical narrative following colonisation and for the spiritual connection the present-day

Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung people have to this place. It was the first place that Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung Ancestors requested as a reserve from the Port Phillip Aboriginal Protectorate in 1840 and this cultural landscape is associated with multiple creation stories. Consequently, in 2020, an application for registration was lodged with the Aboriginal Heritage Registrar as an Aboriginal Cultural Place due to the accumulative tangible and intangible heritage values. The study specifically found that despite land disturbance and ground disturbance, this has not resulted in the removal of the heritage values. We therefore reject the assertion expressed in the Aboriginal Heritage Due Diligence Report which states:

"In this case, significant ground disturbance must be established for the whole activity area as it lies entirely within an area of cultural heritage sensitivity It is the opinion of the consultants that significant ground disturbance is present across the entire activity area and has been caused by excavation and landfill activities associated with land use history that has occurred within the activity area".

The Water Unit does not believe that the reliance on a Heritage Advisor was acceptable in the context of the legislative framework identified above. Such an approach will not be acceptable for any future planning amendments occurring within or impacting upon the declared river lands.

The recommendations of the Water Unit are as follows:

Kind regards

- Appropriate development and zoning of lands within the Bulleen Banyule precinct that secures the Birrarung's footprint <u>for the benefit of the river</u>. This would mean project relocation out of the declared river lands and set back from cultural places.
- That Banyule, Parks Victoria and Ecoline demonstrate via a publicly available document how the proposed project delivers on "net gain" as per the Act.
- •That Banyule, Parks Victoria and Ecoline demonstrate via publicly available document how the proposal aligns with all of the principles of the Act
- That Banyule, Parks Victoria and Ecoline demonstrate via written submission to the Water Unit how the proposed project delivers on the aspirations articulated *Nhanbu narrun ba ngargunin twarn Birrarung* (the Corporation's policy response to the Act).
- That Banyule and Parks Victoria demonstrate via a written submission to the Water Unit what changes in practice will be implemented (and when) to ensure similar missteps will not reoccur.
